Mission


To strengthen local capacity for independent, rigorous inquiry into problems pertinent to the management of African economies, through a synergetic programme combining economic research with postgraduate training in economics

This is a "learning by doing research" modality

- During Biannual Workshops proposals are vetted by resource persons and those found satisfactory are issued a grant
- Research Areas:
 - Poverty, Income Distribution and Food Security
 - Macroeconomic Policy, Investment and Growth
 - Finance and Resource Mobilization
 - Trade and Regional Integration
 - Natural Resource Management and Agricultural Policy Issues

Output to date:

- Support to 2,624 African researchers in 35 African countries
- 109 thematic research papers available on the AERC website
- About 600 researchers enhance their analytical skills in technical workshops

THE COLLABORATIVE PhD PROGRAMME (CPP)

■ The doctoral programme by coursework and thesis is a product of collaboration across the African continent.

■ The collaboration covers:

- Formulation of the rationale and design of the programme itself.
- Development and approval of core and elective course outlines.
- Teaching of the core and elective courses.
- The setting and marking of the comprehensive examinations.
- Supervision of theses: sourcing of supervisors, participation in the thesis workshops, and examination of the theses.
- Having a PhD Academic Board that is responsible for monitoring the progress of the programme.
- Periodic reviews of the programme.
- Human and other resources pooled from within and outside Africa to ensure that this collaboration is continuous, effective and optimal.
